May we commit ourselves to the spiritual work of proclamation and justice, valuing all people and their languages by enabling the translation of your Word into the languages of Indigenous people and other groups.

God of glory, we look forward to that day when people of every language will praise your name in their mother language (Rev. 7:9,10).
