## A PRAYER

Move us as communities of faith and as individuals to not just talk the talk, but also to walk the walk of providing care to the dying, through building and supporting hospices and enabling the provision of palliative care.

We bring before you those who are dying, naming those we know by name..... Move us this day, this week, to be part of their caring community.

These things we pray in the name of Jesus, who brings us the promise of the resurrection. Amen.
